27th September 2022

At a meeting of the **Social & Welfare Committee** held at Dereham Memorial Hall on **Tuesday 27th September 2022** upon the rising of the Markets & Buildings Committee meeting.

Present: Councillors H King (Chairman), H Clarke, S Green, A Greenwood, P Morton and L Monument (substitute for T Monument)

Also present: Councillors P Duigan, Town Clerk Tony Needham and Deputy Town Clerk Jillian Barron.

1. To receive apologies for absence.

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors H Jones-Seymour and T Monument.

2. **Declaration of Interest.**

Councillor H King declared a personal interest in item 3 as he is a member of the Royal British Legion.

3. To consider wreath laying precedence for Remembrance Sunday.

The committee recommended the order of wreath laying be as follows:

- 1. Civic Representatives
- 2. Representatives of regular forces
- 3. Representatives of territorial and reserve forces
- 4. Representatives of ex-Service associations, including RBL & RBLWS
- 5. Direct relatives (parents, siblings, wife/husband, child) of any service personnel who died on active service. Wreaths can be laid either to remember individuals or to remember/represent a particular regiment/branch of service.
- 6. Representatives of uniformed public services (police, fire brigade, ambulance services)
- 7. Representatives of uniformed voluntary services (St John, Red Cross etc)
- 8. Representatives of cadet forces
- 9. Representatives of youth organisations
- 10. Other organisations.
- 11. Members of the public.

4. To consider fees for scattering ashes.

The current fees for scattering ashes is £54 for a parishioner and £119 for a non-parishioner. For scattering, there is no marked plot, the Council provides land for the ashes to be scattered on and a record is kept in perpetuity. There have not been many requests for scattering, a request was made recently by a non-parishioner and it was felt that a fee of £119 seemed a lot for what is being offered.

The committee recommended that the fees for scattering ashes for nonparishioners be reduced to £81, this would equate to the fee for a parishioner plus 50%.

5. **To consider marking the Coronation.**

Then committee recommended that a budget of £10,000 be set aside to mark the Coronation of King Charles III. Councillor S Green agreed to take to lead the in organizing the event.
